More Information About DEF

Diesel Exhaust Fluid (DEF), sometimes called urea, is used by our competitors in Selective Catalytic Reduction (SCR) systems to reduce harmful emissions. A solution of water and automotive grade urea, DEF helps convert nitrogen oxide emissions in diesel exhaust to nitrogen gas and water vapor. Unlike our competitors, RAM trucks meet EPA emission standards without using DEF. Note, however, that RAM chassis cab diesels do use SCR systems with DEF, due to different duty cycles and testing standards.
